

Thank you for your desire to work with us to help protect our community, prevent the spread of disease, and respond to public health emergencies! Volunteers are a vital part of any emergency response. If a communicable disease outbreak or a public health emergency affects our community, we will depend on volunteers to help us respond.

If you are interested in volunteering for the Health Department, there are steps you can take now so that you will be better prepared and able to respond more quickly.

Print out and complete the Volunteer Application form. Bring it with you when the Health Department calls for volunteers. Additional forms may be required at the time of activation, depending on the situation.

Volunteers must complete the following online trainings before volunteering for the Health Department. Be sure to print the certificate of completion for each training and keep them in a file that you can bring with you when the Health Department calls for volunteers. Additional training may be required at the time of activation, depending on the incident.
